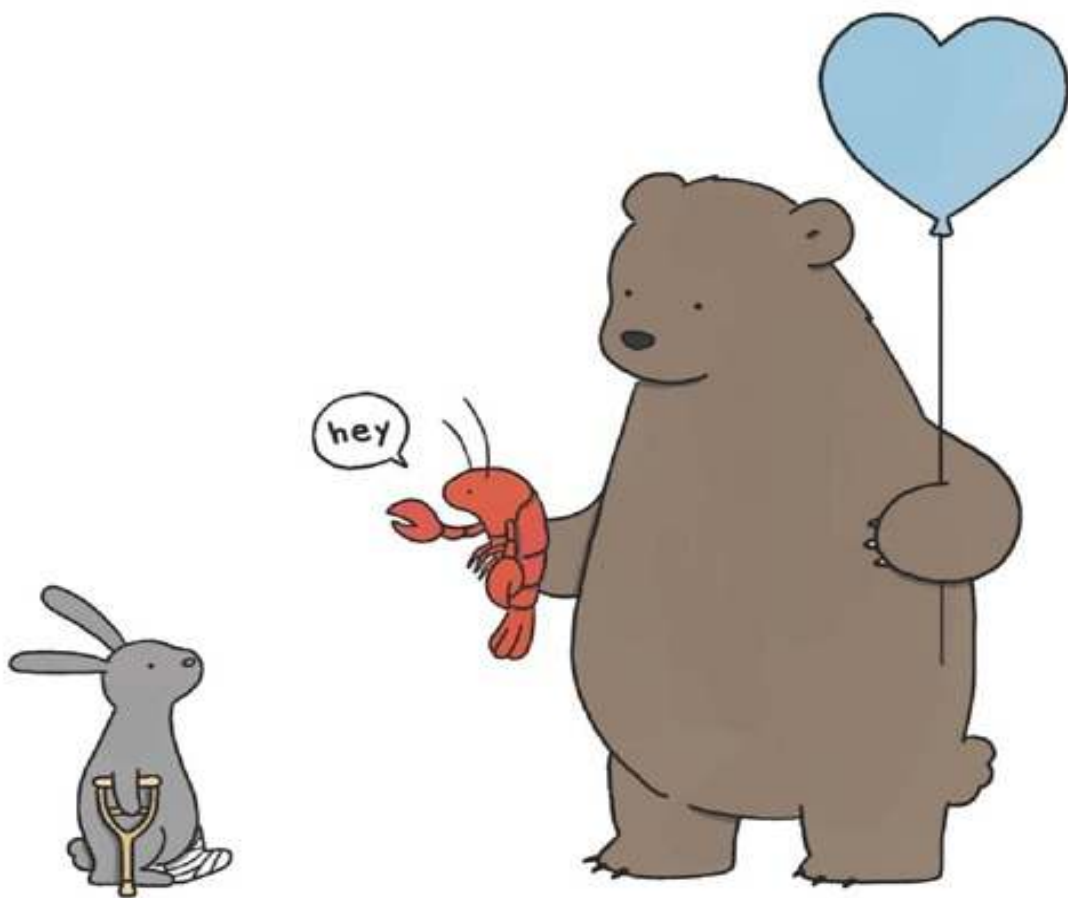
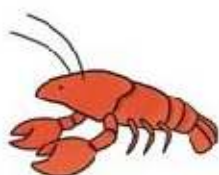

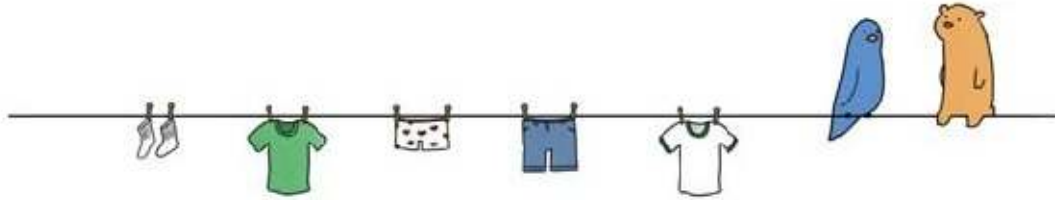

Intr duction

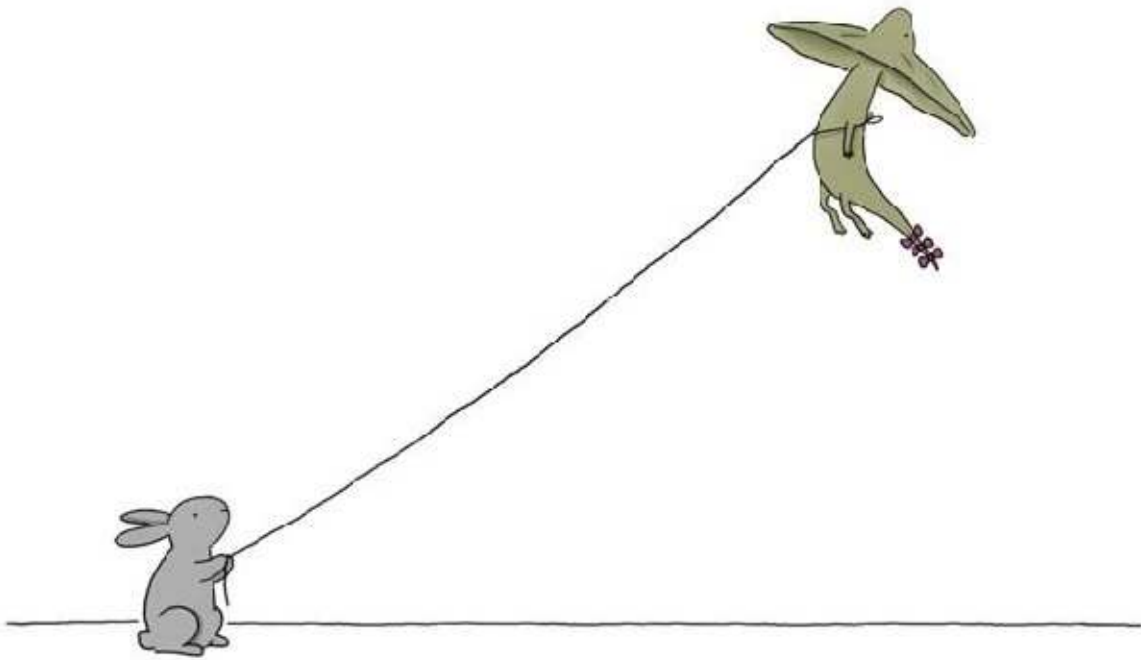
